She said the glimpses of sun reminded her of a book passage that described flickering light across a desert. Captured by that sentence I drove home conscious of the living play of the late day sun across the durum fields, endless sky and waves of grass

This hybrid is a back-cross to the white Oriental 'Allegra,' evident in its spur-tipped buds, recurved flowers, spicy <i>fragrance</i> and late bloom. The long inflorescence carries secondary buds to extend the blooming season.

Fls 45 mm wide; tepals 38 × 15 mm, margins smooth, tips slightly recurved. Lvs whorled, 135 × 32 mm, mid green. Stems 1.5 m, moderate olivegreen (147A), with c.14 fls. Mid June to early July.

11	Fresh Canvas	1	\$10	Lilyfield	Fresh Canvas is just that, ready for a picture to be painted. Set in your garden, you can use a palette of colours and textures to create a scene that is a feast for the eyes. I can imagine Fresh Canvas paired with yellow lilies, lime daylilies, dark green foliage plants and waving in the breeze white gaura. If it is a calming white night garden you are looking for, Fresh Canvas will be cohesive with true white flowers like white nicotiana, roses and petunias. Finally Fresh Canvas planted near a dark red lily like Sungod, or Spring Lake would be a striking contrast. Fresh Canvas has perfectly recurved spotless white flower petals radiating from a lime throat. The colour on the backs of the sepals warms those petals to some extent. This was a favourite of garden visitors last year. It is such a pristine, hopeful flower. I hope you enjoy it. Height: 2.75ft Season: Mid Budcount: 15
12	Fusion	1	\$5	Eric Duma	First bloomed in 2010 at the Mak Hybridization Greenhouses the RHS registry says this: pardalinum × unknown Inside of tepals predominantly orange-red, with large, irregular, golden yellow patch in basal one-third to half; midveins furrowed on inner tepals. Outside of tepals dusky pink; midribs sometimes red-purple. Spots numerous, mahogany, tiny to small circles, in coalescing yellow haloes; stigma dark purple. Tepals touching or slightly overlapping at base, margins smooth, tips recurved; pedicels mid-green. Stems 1 m or more, green. Early (June). A cross between Longiflorum X pardalinum or so I was told.

Kinda Sketchy features purple red dots and dashes, like those from a pencil drawing across a pale peach-cream background that fade to cream on older flowers. Flowers are well placed and recurved elegantly. A nice medium height lily. Try this lily to extend your bloom season. Upfacing, 15 flowers, 1.06m or 3.5 ft tall. Secondary and tertiary buds extend bloom season. Mid-late season
16	Lazy Wave	1	\$10		A big strong plant with a lavender pink flower and white star gives away its Fred Fellner heritage. Lazy Wave is big and tall from Fred Fellner seed. Deep pink flowers fade to medium pink flushed with lavender. Dark pink speckles are spread over the white throat. Orange pollen compliments the petals. The flowers are well spaced on 6 cm long pedicels. Named for the way the petals present like a swimmer paddling easily through gently rolling waves at the lake. This lily has been in the garden and selected for introduction for sometime. From Fred Fellner breeding, the white star on pink is a nod to what was a strong breeding trait coming out of Vermillion, Alberta.
